We are writing to you to inform you of some changes that will be taking place in the coming months to improve the Roundmoor Ditch and notify you of what to expect.

You are invited to join Thames21 in undertaking practical river enhancement solutions to improve the Roundmoor Ditch. The enhancement works will be of natural methods and will involve installing; small deflectors, permeable berms, marginal planting, spiling, and restoring river bank. 15 th / 16 th	Sept	2018	10:30 - 14:30	Permeable berms north (x2).
29 th / 30 th	Sept	2018	10:30 - 14:30	Permeable berms north (x2).

Volunteer Days

Marginal Planting Opportunity

Residents whose gardens border the river will have the opportunity to create an area of natural habitat at the river margin. This will involve planting native river plants in the water which will provide new habitat, reduce bank erosion, and restore the river channel. The plants and improvement materials are available for free.
